Parmacup UWH Tournament

6th September 2014

Organized for the 7th consecutive year, the legendary Parmacup ("the biggest & funniest cup in the world!") gathered a record number of 30 teams for its 2014 edition. Underwater Hockey Switzerland was at the very first one, in 2008, and also subsequently in 2009, 2010 and 2012. So this was actually our fifth appearance at the Parmacup, but the first in our new Wahoo swimsuits!

Eager to show off our new swimsuits, we left Zurich on Friday at 3pm for a 6-hour journey. That gave us plenty of time to discuss about strategy for our new 2-3-1 formation, and also to give ourselves Italian nicknames for the occasion once we crossed the Italian border: welcome Robino, Martino,
